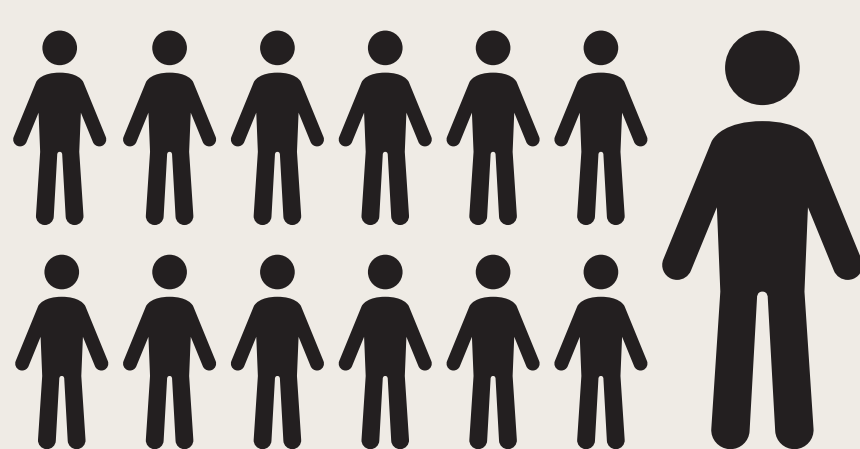

4. INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE, AND REPAIR OCCUPATIONS
5. CONSTRUCTION AND EXTRACTION OCCUPATIONS

OVERSIGHT IS LACKING

OSHA, the agency responsible for overseeing workplace safety, has only 2,100 inspectors responsible for the health and safety of 130 million workers.

That's one compliance officer for every 59,000 workers.

Texas is the only state in the nation that doesn't require any private sector employers to carry workplace injury coverage.
